God Made My Eyes

Lesson 2

Scripture: Psalm 101:3 - "I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes. . ."

<u>INTRODUCTION</u>: God is such an awesome God! When He created the earth and all the things in it, He created it with so much color. Some of these colors can never be duplicated in a lab, they are just God's creation. He could have made the earth black and white. How dull would that have been?! God loves us so much. He wanted us to enjoy all that we see with our eyes. God made our EYES.

I <u>GOD ALLOWS ME TO SEE</u>

A. My TWO eyes

God created so many wonderful things that it was too much for us to see with just one eye, so He gave us TWO! How thoughtful God is to us. Each of you have your own unique qualities about your eyes. God gave you your own:

- eye color
- eye shape
- eye size

Your eyes may be similar to your parents' eyes, but they are still unique to you.

B. My "TALKING" eyes

Our eyes may be small, but they tell all that is going on in our body. Our eyes can tell others so much about us such as:

- when we are sad (sometimes our sad eyes even water with tears)
- when we are sick
- when we are happy
- when we are scared

It has been said that our eyes are the "*windows to the soul*". Our eyes tell what is going on in our heart. Sometimes, there are illness when the eyes will turn yellow and other times the eyes will get red if you don't get enough sleep or have been look at your video game too long.

C. My TIRED eyes

Although God gave us two eyes, it was not because one was a spare eye. We need our two eyes to work together to be able to see on our right side and on our left side. It is important to take care of the eyes God has given. He has put your eyes into sockets on your head where they are protected by your skull. But He also expects you to take care of your eyes by making sure you give them rest. Don't let your eyes get tired by staying up too late at night and not getting enough rest. When you are watching TV or reading, or playing games, take a break for a few minutes and give your eyes a rest. Don't allow sharp objects to get near your eyes and try to always wear sunglasses when outside in the bright sun. Your two eyes must last you eighty years or more, so take care of them!

II <u>GOD SEES ME</u>

God gave us our eyes for His glory as He did for everything He created. It is a sin for us to use our eyes in a way that is displeasing to Him. God knows and sees all that you do. He sees what you see. If you are watching something on TV that you know is wrong, God sees you. If see something you want and steal it, God sees you. If you look at someone else's paper during a test, God sees you. BUT, if you look at your Bible and read it, God sees you. If you see someone in trouble and help them, God sees you. If you turn the channel when something bad comes on, God sees you. God sees all you do - good and bad. Use the two beautiful eyes He has given you for good and for His glory to honor Him. Don't waste the gift God has given to you.
